Faith over Fear: Trust in the Lord Pastor Gordon Peterson

I read a quote the other day that is so true: "The only thing that has spread faster than the Coronavirus itself is the FEAR raging around it." Although this is a serious medical situation, it has caused widespread panic and alarm like we have never seen before.

Here in the United States, schools and universities have suspended classes, non-essential workers have been asked to stay home from work, streets and airports are like ghost towns. The stock market has been going up and down.

Even though we are going through this difficult time, we can know that we serve a God who has promised to "never leave us or forsake us" (Hebrews 13:5). Before He left this earth, Jesus said "He would be with us always" (Matthew 28:20), Hebrews 13:6 says, "The Lord is my helper; I will not fear", and Jesus called Himself the "Good Shepherd" in John 10:11-17.

Jesus loves us and Psalms 23:1 reads, "The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want." The shepherd had a relationship with his sheep and knew them by name; he led them out of the sheep pen. In the same way, Jesus knows us. He knows what we are going through at this time of crisis. The shepherd goes before the sheep and they follow him because they know his voice. Are you listening to the voice of the Good Shepherd? He is going before us, leading us. As we have faith and we depend on our Good Shepherd, we can know that He will take care of us.

Verse 2 tells us that "He makes me to lie down in green pastures; He leads me beside the still waters." The "green" pastures are the new, tender grass. Sheep graze all day long, and they can't digest all the grass they graze on until they lie down. They don't have the good sense to do it on their own, so they have to be made to lie down. God knows what we need and, as our "Good Shepherd", He leads

us and sometimes, "makes" us lie down in green pastures. One of the blessings of this crisis is that families have more time together. They are eating and praying together.

Sheep have an instinctive fear of moving waters. Their wool is heavy and if they fell into the water, they would likely drown, so the shepherd piles up rocks to make a still

pool where they can get water to drink. In the same way, Jesus has made a safe place for us. He will provide the green pastures and still waters we need. We don't need to fear ... He is preparing safe places for us.

Verse 3 says, "He restores my soul; He leads me in the paths of righteousness for His name's sake." How often do we stand in the crossroads ... which is the right path? Do our actions glorify God? We can know that He is leading us and directing our paths. America needs to be restored ... and only the Good Shepherd can do that.

<u>In verse 4 we read</u>, "Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil; for You are with me; Your rod and staff, they comfort me." Even though we are in the midst of a crisis, we don't have to fear anything, because we know that He is with us. His rod will guide us and his staff will correct us when we need it. We are comforted by the fact that He loves us and He is with us.

Verse 5 tells us, "You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; You anoint my head with oil; my cup runs over." What a comfort it is to know that He has prepared a table for us ... our heads are anointed ... and our cup runs over. This is a beautiful, descriptive verse of the Christian life ... abundance ... joy unspeakable ... peace that passes human understanding!

Many people have commented that they miss our CLMO gatherings, and the Koinonia fellowship that is shared at these meetings. We will keep you informed as we have more information.



Report of Missions Trip to Mayan Indians in Tizmin, Mexico

On February 19th, 2020; I was blessed to be able to go on a 7-day mission trip with Pastor Randy Gerold and his team to the city of Tizimin, in the Yucatan, Mexico.

We partnered with DCI missions. Direct Christian Impact which is a faith-based organization that mobilizes Christian mission teams throughout the year, bringing aid

to people who need it the most.

We arrived late in the evening and first thing the next morning, DCI gave us our daily assignments. We were involved in many projects, including community aid projects. We ministered to Mayan children at the Magdelina's childrens' site, which is a day program for children to play, do various activities and learn about Jesus. We were

involved in feeding programs where we went to villages and distributed bags of food. Although the bags of food were enough for maybe only one small meal, the people were so thankful and were open to the Gospel and to prayer.

There were park outreaches and eye glass clinics too. We brought reader glasses of different strengths for families that cannot afford glasses or do not have access to an eye doctor. What a blessing to see the looks on their faces when they were finally able to read the tracts we gave them about the Lord. After many of the women received the glasses, they could now start sewing and embroidering again, which for most households, is how they make a living. Many were touched and received salvation.

The team was able to minister at three different churches, and after one of the services, the people went and brought the mayor of the city and his family to receive prayer. We also participated in a Mayan womens' conference, where some of the women rode on buses for over four hours just to be able to attend, fellowship and hear the Gospel from other women.

The people in Tizimin still live and follow the Mayan traditions of their ancestors. They don't have a lot of resources for jobs or food, but they are very loving and caring people. I was so blessed to be able to serve them and share with them the Good News of Jesus. I'm excited and looking forward to going again later this year as the Lord leads.
