### GOD'S REOUIREMENT: REPENTANCE

#### Text: Acts 2:38 (NKJV)

"Then Peter said to them, 'REPENT, and let every one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins ..."

In a recent survey, people who regularly attend church were asked to articulate what the word "repentance" meant to them. The majority of those who participated in the survey stated they believed the word "repentance" meant one or more of the following:

- 1. To "feel" sorry about something one did or failed to do.
- 2. To "feel" remorseful about some act and to ask for forgiveness for it.
- 3. To walk forward in a church service to formally ask Jesus into one's heart.

Although these answers are interesting, none of them is correct!

The word "repent" is a very important word in the New Testament. It was first used in Matt. 3:2, Mark 1:4 and Luke 3:3 where John the Baptist preached: repentance!

#### Matthew 3:2 (NKJV)

"... and saying, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!"

John's Ministry was literally launched with that one word "repent". According to his preaching, the only way to enter into the Kingdom of Heaven was through repentance!

Jesus, too, began His public ministry by beckoning His listeners to "repent" as stated in Matthew 4:17.

#### MATTHEW 4:17 (NKJV)

"From that time Jesus began to preach and to say, 'repent, for the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand."

**Peter** also began his preaching ministry speaking about repentance.

#### **ACTS 2:38 (NKJV)**

"Then Peter said to them, 'repent', and let every one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins."

Peter understood that repentance is the only way to truly be delivered from the kingdom of darkness and to emerge spiritually reborn and filled with the life of God.

Real repentance is very different from remorse. Yet "feelings" of remorse for a past action was one of the most frequent definitions given by people who were a part of the aforementioned survey.

The Greek word for "remorse" in the New Testament is different than the word for "repent". The word used for "remorse" gives a picture of someone, like Judas, who was consumed with remorse, guilt or regret, but it seldom refers to someone moved to change.

The Greek word for "repent" is much more. It first and foremost meant a change of mind, and it represents the call to turn or to change one's attitudes and ways. This word "repent" gives the image of a person changing from top to bottom — a total transformation wholly affecting every part of a person's life. It reflects a turn, a change of direction, a new course, and a completely altered view of life and behavior.

This is not the same as a fleeting sorrow for past actions, but a solid, decision of the mind to take a new direction, to turn about-face and to revise the pattern of one's life. Emotions may accompany repentance, but are not required to repent.

Real repentance is a mental choice to leave a life of sin, flesh, and selfishness, and to turn toward God with all of one's heart and mind in order to follow Jesus.

As you grow in your walk with God, the Holy Spirit will continue to reveal things in your life that need to change. Be quick to repent and quick to change!

Let's all pray that we will be a part of the Third Great Awakening in the United States of America!
